
Simple activities designed to help parents and/or caregivers participate in, and support, a child's literacy skills and educational goals:



• Easiest: Read the story together. You will find lots of exaggeration in a "tall tale". What are some examples of exaggerations in this "tall tale"?

More Difficult: Vowels include A, E, I, O, U, and, sometimes, Y. Watch for long vowel sounds made with these long vowel patterns:

consonant/vowel/vowel or vowel/consonant/vowel

 Challenging: As you read the story, watch for Tennessee "tall tale" words, like holler, critter, and corn pone. Look up any unfamiliar words in a dictionary to find their meaning and build your vocabulary.
