
Simple activities designed to help parents and/or caregivers participate in, and support, a child's literacy skills and educational goals:



- Easiest: Read the story together. Point out the capital W and the lowercase W. Listen to the sound it makes. How many upper and lowercase w's can you find on each page?
- More Difficult: Woolsey's name begins with W. What sound does Ww make? Find a picture in a book or magazine of another word that begins with W, like watermelon.
- Challenging: Nouns are words for a person, a place, or a thing. Look at these nouns from the story: swamp, Woolsey, bed, Granny, school, raft. Tell if each is a person, a place, or a thing.
